Online Ordering - School Lunches



From Monday 17th April, parents and carers will be required to pre-order and pay for their child's meals for the week ahead using the online portal from our caterer, Innovate.

The pre-ordering of school meals is key to reducing food waste (and our carbon footprint), as well as ensuring that kitchen staff know what they are cooking as early as possible each morning and that parents and carers have access to clear information on allergens. It also means that the children have a full choice of what is on offer each day without risk of missing something they like.

From 17th April, pre-ordering will be the only way in which school meals can be booked – we will no longer be able to accept on the day orders.

Orders for each week must be placed and paid for by the midnight of the previous Saturday. For example, to order for the first week back after the Easter holiday (week commencing 17/04/23), the

order must be placed and paid for by midnight on Saturday 15th April. You can order one week at a time or for the whole term.

In order to prepare for this change, you are invited to register on the Innovate portal from today onwards. This will enable you to be ready to pre-order at the start of the summer term. You will need to register even if your child only occasionally has a school meal as this will be the only way to book and pay for them.

All children in Reception to Year 2 are entitled to free school meals under the Universal Infant Free School Meals programme. Children are also entitled to free school meals if you are in receipt of a number of benefits including universal credit and income support. If you are unsure about your eligibility for free school meals, please contact the school office. Even if your child is entitled to a free meal you will need to register on the portal to pre-order meals.

We currently have some spaces available in our wonderful Nursery Class, Acorns, for September 2023. We are able to offer provision from 9am - 3pm Monday to Friday with the children in Nursery also able to access our wraparound care at the start and end of the day. We are accept 30 hour funded childcare places as well as universal 15 hour provision and can offer a mixture of whole days, mornings and afternoons. The children at Acorns have access to a superb Early Years provision which helps develop their independence and learning to prepare them for the transition into school. 
A reminder that the photographer will be in school on Friday 31 March to take class photos.

It promises to be a super trip and we look forward to hearing all about it on their return!


Y3/4 Spring Music Festival


Are you worried about a child, family or friend?
