

Eco Council News Update

Our new Eco Council for 2023/4 have made a fantastic start to the new year. We've completed our annual planting of bee and butterfly friendly bulbs for next spring and have replanted the planters at the entrance to the school.

Pre-Loved Uniform and Christmas Jumper Shop

Did you know?

- Textile production contributes more to climate change than international aviation and shipping combined.
- Extending the life of clothes by just 9 months of active use would reduce carbon, water and waste footprints by 20-30% each.
- In the UK, we buy more clothes per person than any other country in Europe.

In 2022/3, Eco Council re-sold 53 items of pre-loved uniform and unnamed lost property and took a further 63 items to the textile recycling bank.

We will next be running our pre-loved uniform shop at the PTA Winter Fair on Friday 1st December to help both the environment and people's wallets.

Eco Council are also inviting you to donate any **unmarked and clean children's Christmas jumpers** that may no longer fit your child to sell at this event, in preparation for Christmas Jumper Day 2023. Please pass any donations of Christmas jumpers to Miss Cridland or drop off at the school office by Monday 27th November. Please note that due to storage constraints, we cannot accept any donations of school uniform at this time.

Each item of clothing on sale will cost just 50p or the equivalent fair token.

Thanks to the PTA and to you in advance for your support. With the money raised last year, we were able to fund the BPS sunflower growing competition, buy a number of resources to support the establishment of our community orchard, as well as new plants and bird brooders for the courtyard and a new hedgehog house and planting for the wildlife area.



Can we politely remind parents and carers about the importance of wearing the correct school uniform. We have noticed that some children are currently not. We do have some spare jumpers if you need one. Parents now have a choice of purchasing uniform with or without logos in order to keep the price down. If a child has had their ears pierced they must wear a simple stud only as this is for their health and safety. Please speak to us if you need some help with anything to do with uniform.

Red sweatshirt or cardigan (with or without school logo) with either

- · Red or white polo shirt (with or without school logo) and
- Black or charcoal grey trousers, shorts, pinafore dress, skirt or culottes

Or

• Red and white checked dress

FOOTWEAR:

- A pair of hard-soled indoor shoes (no slippers black plimsolls or Croc-style shoes are ideal)
- A sensible and hard-wearing pair of outdoor shoes; no flip-flops, open-toed sandals or beach-style footwear.

OUR PE KIT IS:

- White t-shirt
- Black or navy shorts
- Black or navy jogging trousers
- Trainers or plimsolls

Uniform can be purchased from a range of well-known retail outlets, including supermarkets. Items with the school logo can be purchased from our supplier.

New mental health text line - HEAR 85258

A new mental health free text messaging support service has launched in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough to help those who are struggling to cope.

Launched by NHS Cambridgeshire & Peterborough and in partnership with the national service SHOUT², the free to use text service HEAR 85258 provides real-time support to people of all ages who are struggling with their mental health.

When texting the word HEAR to 85258, the person will be connected to a trained volunteer who will take them from a place of crisis to a place of calm. During the confidential and anonymous conversation, the texter will be supported and signposted to local and national mental health services.

Texting HEAR to 85258 is free, discreet and runs 24/7. It won't appear on any bills and requires no app, data, password, or registration. It is available for anybody who lives, works, or studies in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.
