Premier League Stars Kit Scheme



As you will have probably heard by now the school received some special visitors on the last day of term. This was the press release that followed that day:

Member of Parliament for South East Cambridgeshire, Lucy Frazer MP, has held a special assembly at Bottisham Community Primary School to give away free kit to a young girls' football team at the school.

The kit - which includes 13 outfield sets and one goalkeeper set - has been funded by the Premier League Charitable Fund as part of the organisation's 'Primary Stars Kit Scheme', which is designed to encourage more young girls to participate in football.

The annual scheme has been open to all primary schools in England and Wales, and teachers across the country were able to apply for the Nike football kit for their girls' teams.

During the assembly, Ms Frazer shared with the children about the value of engaging with sports and the inspiring example of the Lionesses in recent years.

She was also able to show the pupils the official Premier League trophy, which was presented at the front and available all morning for children to get a photo.

Following this, the selected girls team were able to try on their new kit and have a kick-about on the school pitches.

In addition to Bottisham Community Primary School, a number of other local schools benefited from the scheme, including:

- Marleigh Primary Academy

Lucy Frazer, MP for South East Cambridgeshire, said: "I am delighted that so many girls' teams have received their free Primary Stars kits from the Premier League.


Acorn Class
